Dear Dr. Campbell:

It is my pleasure to inform you that the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) has accepted your certifications for continued listing as a Patient Safety Organization for another three-year period. Your new period of listing will expire at midnight (2400 hours) on April 23, 2019.

The requirements pertaining to the period of initial listing also pertain to the periods of continued listing.

First, to remain listed, each PSO must submit an attestation that it has met the requirement to enter two bona fide Patient Safety Act contracts in every 24-month period that began with your initial date of listing nearly three years ago. The regulatory requirement can be found at section 3.102(b)(2)(i)(C) of the Patient Safety Rule.

Second, each time that you enter a Patient Safety Act contract with a provider, and each time you enter a new, potentially-reportable relationship with that provider, the PSO must assess whether it needs to submit a disclosure statement regarding the relationship. The requirements for the types of relationships a PSO needs to report and instructions for how to complete a disclosure statement can be found at section 3.102(d)(2) of the Rule.

Finally, whenever the PSO undergoes an organizational change, a change in PSO information that is posted on our PSO Web site, a change of authorizing official, or any change in the accuracy of your attestations, you must notify AHRQ. AHRQ staff will direct you regarding next steps.
